MINUTES OF THE MEETING

24th August 2012

A meeting of the Central Steering Committee for Measles Catch-up campaign was held on 24th August 2012 under the chairmanship of Joint Secretary (RCH) to share the achievement made so far and the next steps for the upcoming Phase 3. The following members attended the meeting:

- JS (RCH) in his opening remarks briefed the importance of this measles campaign
 and its direct relation to address MDG4 goal. He stressed upon the need of a team
 work to maximize the coverage in the upcoming campaign.
- DC (I) made a presentation highlighting the disease burden of measles, the strategy
 to introduce 2nd dose of measles, coverage and lessons learnt from Phase 1&2,
 detailed plan of phase 3 and expectations from other ministries and partners.
- DC (CH&I) shared the genesis of the National Steering Committee and indicated the critical role of schools and panchayats in successful implementation of campaign.
- Representative from other ministries and partners provided their views and comments on the subject.
- NCDC reported that currently the maximum numbers of Measles outbreak are being reported from the 5 states i.e. UP, Bihar, Rajasthan, MP and Gujarat and a successful campaign in these states will reduce the morbidity and mortality due to measles.

- During the meeting, issues related to role of various ministries and partners in the upcoming Phase III were discussed and following decisions were taken:
- MoHFW will write to State Chief Secretaries with a copy to State Health Secretaries for active participation of schools, Anganwari workers and Panchayats during the Measles Catch up campaign.
- MoHFW will write to State Health Secretaries indicating the partners willingness to support this activity and for their appropriate involvement in the campaign
- MoHFW will write to CBSE and ICSC requesting to issue directives to the schools for participation
- 4. MoHFW will draft letters for Secretaries of Ministry of Women and Child Development, Ministry of Panchayati Raj and Ministry of HRD to be addressed to Secretaries of the 5 states in respective ministries
- Lions Club will circulate the message of participation and active support to all
 its members. Representative from MoHFW will brief the Lions club Governors
 during their meeting scheduled on 25th -26th September 2012
- The sensitization in UP will be done at regional level and special focus will be given to urban planning.
- 7. NCDC will monitor the before and after impact of campaign in the 5 states.
- 8. For any Adverse Event Following Immunization (AEFI), 108 ambulance services will be kept on high alert during the campaign period in each district
- Indian Red Cross Society will work in 20 districts and will involve 10,000
 volunteers for mobilization, demand generation and other supportive activities
 during the campaign.
- 10. All partners i.e. WHO, UNICEF, Lions Club Int., IRCS need to share their workplan during the Phase III to prevent overlap and duplication of efforts.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to all the members.
