# Sub.: Promoting education regarding digital payment in schools Sir/Madam,

Government of India is making efforts for promotion of digital payments and enabling convenient digital payment modes throughout the country. Ministry of Electronics & IT (MeitY) is coordinating with all stakeholders for proliferation of digital payment ecosystem in the country.

- Appropriate incorporation of digital payment in school curriculum accompanied with adequate activity based programs is crucial for facilitating wider adoption of digital payments. Younger generation being early adopters of technology may help their families to get comfortable with various digital payment modes.
- Accordingly, NCERT, CBSE, ICSE and all State education boards in India are requested to consider following interventions for promotion of digital payments:
  - Introduction of activity based programs to impart hands-on experience of various digital payment modes to students through trainings sessions. seminars, case studies, quizzes, games etc
  - Incorporation of digital payments in school curriculum starting from middle school for creation of awareness about various digital payment modes such as UPI, UPI QR code (static/dynamic), Debit/Credit Card (including Rupay), BBPS, NCMC, BHIM Aadhaar, IMPS, NEFT, RTGS, Internet Banking and e-Wallets
  - Appropriate use of Information & Communication Technologies (ICT) to deliver engaging and interactive education on digital payments including videos (youtube, PMG Disha etc)
  - Advisories to affiliated schools for enabling digital payment of school fees through appropriate modes such as Bharat Bill Payments System (BBPS), UPI QR code etc. (MeitY's communication No. 12/5/2017-DPD-MeitY(Vol.-II) dated 15.01.2020 regarding BBPS is enclosed)
  - V. Helping students/parents in digital payment of school fees
  - vi. Awareness programs about secure usage of various digital payment modes
  - Providing adequate training to teachers to enable them to deliver digital vii. payment education to students
- National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) is a "Not for Profit" organization (under Section 8 of Companies Act 2013), is an initiative of Reserve Bank of India (RBI) for creation of a robust Payment & Settlement Infrastructure in India. NPCI is







willing to get involved with NCERT, CBSE and other education boards to provide required assistance in integration of digital payment content in the school curriculum along with training of teachers for enabling them to deliver effective digital payment education to students.

NCERT is requested to refer to their communication No. PS(D)/6-142/2018 dated 07.04.2018 regarding "Digital Payments in Course Curriculum for Financial Literacy" and to provide an opportunity to NPCI to offer required assistance in integration of digital payments in National Curriculum Framework, in light of National Education Policy (NEP) 2019.
- 6. CBSE, ICSE and State education boards are requested to coordinate with NPCI to introduce activity based programs for promotion of digital payments and to provide required training to the teachers. Relevant instructions may be issued to all affiliated schools.
