SUBJECT: Reduced Syllabi at the ICSE (Class X) and ISC (Class XII) Levels for the Examination Year 2022

This is further to the CISCE's letters to Heads of Schools, dated 2nd July and 9th 2021 regarding its decision to review its existing syllabi at the ICSE (Class X) and ISC (Class XII) levels for the Year 2022 Examination in view of the **continuing pandemic situation and the difficulties being faced by schools in transacting the syllabus.**

The CISCE has already brought out the reduced syllabi for a number of subjects (Class X) and ISC (Class XII) levels, for the Year 2022 Examination, which are available on the CISCE website www.cisce.org.

The CISCE has now completed the process of syllabus review for the remaining subjects at the ICSE and ISC levels; specifically for Classes X and XII, for the Examination Year 2022 and made modifications/reductions in several subjects, in consultation with subject experts.

You are requested to intimate all concerned regarding the ICSE and ISC Reduced Syllabi for the Year 2022 Examination.

As you are aware, we are in the midst of the pandemic, and there is uncertainty as to when schools across the country will be able to return to normalcy. It is reiterated that the **concerned subject teachers transact the syllabus strictly according to the sequence of topics given in the syllabus. This will ensure that all CISCE affiliated schools are broadly teaching the same topics at any given point of time as well as facilitate subsequent reduction in syllabus, if required.**



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Further, please note that the **Project Work** already completed/ initiated by the candidates in different subject/s, on topics which have been removed from the Syllabus, is to be accepted and marked.
